Some of these you may have already studied in either US History 1 or 2, but a few might be new to you. The second page of this document provides you with a template for a case brief. You are to fill one of these in for each of the five (5) cases. These do not need to be incredibly detailed, we will take care of that in class. One or two pages max per case. *Second: you will respond to an in-class essay the first week that we are back in school in September regarding one of the five cases.* This assignment will be due the first day that we are back in September.
